Flagship: The Young Women in Agriculture, A 5-Year National Empowerment Programme (Launched June 2023)

The AGRICULTURE pillar of SIP-ALPHA is not just about farming, it is about building a new generation of globally certified agricpenuers, positioned as a transformative driver of inclusive growth, food security, and global competitiveness. Launched in June 2023, Young-WAP is a five-year national empowerment programme designed to cultivate a new generation of globally certified women agripreneurs advancing the principles of gender equality, poverty eradication, and climate resilience, while also delivering bankable, investment-ready opportunities for sustainable growth.

By integrating alternative means of crop productions, including hydroponics, vertical farming, biotechnology, and controlled-environment agriculture, Young-WAP strengthens climate-smart agriculture and enhances adaptive capacity in line with the Paris Agreement, FAO frameworks, and corporate ESG standards. At its core, the programme seeks to break the poverty cycle through the kenaf value chain, underpinned by guaranteed off-takers that ensure predictable incomes, market stability, and long-term sustainability.

## **Core Strategic Components**

- Alternative Means of Crop Production Systems: Scaling hydroponics, vertical farming, biotech, and controlled-environment agriculture to achieve year-round productivity, resource efficiency, and resilience to climate shocks.
- Kenaf Value Chain Transformation: Establishing a fully integrated kenaf ecosystem, from cultivation to processing into fibre, paper, textiles, and bio-composites, with guaranteed off-takers to secure livelihoods, reduce rural poverty, and create export-ready industries.
- Certified Multiple International Partners: Beneficiaries trained and certified by multiple international partners, including the London School of Management in (Hydroponics and Agro-Kenaf Enterprise), ensuring world-class recognition and ensuring compliance with international quality standards and enhancing global market competitiveness,
- Inclusive Market Systems: Facilitating structured off-take agreements, value-addition, cold-chain logistics, and trade facilitation, linking women-led enterprises to regional and global value chains,
- Gender-Responsive Financing: Mobilizing blended finance, catalytic capital, and micro-grants to expand access to finance for women agripreneurs, in line with UN Women's empowerment frameworks and corporate impact-investment models.
- Impact Orientation: Advancing rural prosperity, women's inclusion, food system resilience, and poverty reduction, consistent with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development while also delivering measurable ROI and scalable growth opportunities.
