- Conflict Prevention & Mediation: Deploying inclusive dialogue platforms and restorative justice mechanisms to resolve disputes before they become violent.
- Justice Reforms: Enhancing rule of law, access to justice, and accountability, aligned with international human rights standards.
- Youth as Agents of Peace: Empowering young people as peace ambassadors and intelligence partners, reducing their vulnerability to radicalization.
- Strategic Partnerships: Leveraging government, civil society, private sector, and international partners to co-finance and co-implement scalable solutions.
- Technology-Enabled Security: Integrating *digital surveillance, data analytics, and AI-driven early-warning systems to enhance intelligence gathering and rapid response.
